The OAO 2018 Codequest™ seminar has been approved for **4.0 hours** of self-assessment CME by the American Board of Ophthalmology. This credit will be helpful to those pursuing maintenance of certification. Your CME certificate from the coding seminar (from the AAO) serves as your proof of attendance should you need it.

Self-assessment CME is in addition to (and distinct from) the Category 1 CME issued by the AAO.

To receive the SACME credit, physicians will need to complete a quick multiple-choice quiz after the seminar. The link for the quiz will be emailed to you or use the QR code below or go to this link now:

To claim the SACME credit (regardless of how you score on the quiz), you must log on to your own ABO status page and attest to meeting their CME/SACME requirement. According to the ABO, the annual CME requirement for Track II diplomates is 25 CME credits, which includes 8 SACME credits. Attestation to completion of their requirement takes place bi-annually. You do have the ability to log course details on your MOC status page via the CME Tracker as you earn them.
